With Open Arms

The Bible tells us that God knows each of us and knows us completely through and through. It is written that the Lord is with us always, everywhere we are whether in a crowd or all alone, in the light or in the dark, we are not alone for He will never leave us nor forsake us. We can run but we cannot hide. We can dodge to the left or to the right, but the Lord is still there in the straight and narrow, waiting for us at the gate to the sheepfold. It is written: Psalm 139:1-6 You have searched me, Lord, and you know me. You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar. You discern my going out and my lying down; you are familiar with all my ways. Before a word is on my tongue you, Lord, know it completely. You hem me in behind and before, and you lay your hand upon me. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain.

If the Lord in His prevenient Grace is pursuing us throughout our lives, how are we responding? The Bible tells us: 1 John 4:7-12 Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.

I want us to consider the lyrics to a song written in 1981 by Stephen Ray Perry and Jonathan Cain which is titled "Open Arms". Open arms is defined as an eager or warm welcome expressing acceptance and a desire to embrace. I want us to consider singing it to our Lord worshipfully and prayerfully as our personal response to God's mercy, grace, and the love that God has each of us. No matter where we have been, where we are or what lies ahead, let us visualize reaching out and reaching up with open arms to embrace our Lord and Savior.

Lying beside you, here in the dark, feeling your heartbeat with mine Softly you whisper, you're so sincere, how could our love be so blind? We sailed on together, we drifted apart, and here you are, by my side.

So now I come to you, with open arms, nothing to hide, believe what I say
So here I am, with open arms
Hoping you'll see, what your love means to me, open arms.

Living without you, living alone, this empty house seems so cold Wanting to hold you, wanting you near, how much I want to bring you home But now that you've come back, turned night into day, I need you to stay.




CALLING ALL BAKERS
