Why the church exists?

What is the most important question you should ask in your life? Why am I here? Many struggle with the reason they are alive. Some wonder if they are some cosmic coincidence. Often people fall prey to the false teaching that we are nothing more than a freak combination of chemicals that accidentally came together and made life.

This leads to the old saying "Eat, drink, and be merry for Tomorrow we die." It is the cancerous idea that we cease to exist after death. Many have allowed themselves based on this idea to become the center of their own miniature universe. It is the Burger King Mentality. My Way. (Jesus is the way so we have his way here.)

There are many false ideas and false teachings that distract us from our real purpose in life. In the letter to the Colossians Paul is dealing with the problem of false teaching.

False teaching will distract us from our course. False teaching will disturb our faith.

False teaching will diminish our light for the Lord.

In Paul's work to overcome the false teaching he brilliantly shows us our individual purpose as well as the purpose for the Church's existence.

So ask yourself the all-important question: Why does the church exist?

Let's translate that into our church, St. Mark's Lutheran Church, some of you may ask why do we meet, why study the Bible, why, why? Let's answer both questions with one Bible verse Colossians 1.16c "all things have been created through Him (the Lord Jesus Christ) and for Him.

We are not some cosmic coincidence, we are not an accident, we were created by God and for God. From the individual to the individual churches. The bible here teaches that God created everyone who has ever lived or ever will. Not only did God create everyone. He created everyone for Himself. Paul said it this way in 1 Corinthians 6.19c - 20 "you are not your own, for you have been bought with a price: therefore glorify (exalt, lift up) God in your body."

To glorify in this passage means to praise, magnify, celebrate, and honor God. It also conveys the idea of getting others to acknowledge God's greatness. The church exists to exalt Jesus. Exalt means to raise in rank, status, or character. To honor glorify and praise.

As the church we are called Christians. A way to understand the definition of Christian is to say we are little Christ's. Let's investigate the bare necessities of lifting Jesus up in rank and status as members of St. Marks's Lutheran.

We are called to follow His lead and reach out to all those who are suffering, those who are hungry, naked and forgotten. Jesus reached out to everyone and as Christians we are called to do likewise. The church exists to serve God. The church exists to shine light in this dark world and the church exists to glorify the name of the Lord. So we all need to be united in mission, ministry and motivation and do the

things that the Lord is calling us to do. So let us go forward with the assurance that God is always with us and we can do all things through Christ who strengthens us. Amen. Submitted

St. Mark's Lutheran Church Mid-Year Informational Meeting

St. Mark's Council made a resolution at our Annual Meeting to periodically hold informational meetings with the congregation. On Sunday, July 14, 2013, we held our mid-year meeting to provide an update on our financial status as well as our various ministries. The following is a summary of what was discussed.

Finance

Please see the enclosed financial summary sheet, the treasurer's report, a graph of income versus expenses and a summary of Pastor Rodney's compensation package. Debbie Palmatier noted that our year-to-date income is much less than our expenses, that we have no control over some of the expenses such as heating, electricity, etc. and that we have failed to meet our average of \$5600 income each month to break even. Our Vision Fund, which is used to pay our mortgage, is also falling short each month. The extra money we had at the beginning of 2013 is now gone so we no longer have the financial cushion with which we started the year. A reminder was given that even though God provides for us, He also calls us to be good stewards of the blessings He has given.

If anyone would like to become a member of the Finance Committee, please contact Debbie. Currently serving on this committee with her are: Diane France, Sharon Nesbitt and Gene Wyckoff. New people and new ideas are welcome.

Property

The stain-glass windows in the sanctuary need to be repaired. Members of the congregation are able to replace the caulking and paint them; however, the lead glass repair is going to be costly so we are seeking a grant and/or will do fundraisers to pay for the work to be done.

Landscaping around all of our buildings is looking great.

Worship and Music

The handbells, which were in the flood, are in need of a professional cleaning so we are trying to locate a place where we can get this done.

We are happy that we will have new members join us in September.

Christian Education / Youth Activities

NALC Convocation to meet Aug. 8-9 in Pittsburgh, Pa.

Members of congregations of the North American Lutheran Church from throughout the United States and Canada will gather Aug. 8-9 in Pittsburgh, Pa., for the annual NALC Convocation around the theme, "Come to the Water of Life."

The NALC Convocation is one of four events that will take place Aug. 6-9 at the Sheraton Station Square Hotel in Pittsburgh. The NALC Convocation will be preceded by Lutheran CORE's Convocation on Aug. 6 and by the Theological Conference sponsored by Lutheran CORE and the NALC on Aug. 6-7. The Women of the NALC will meet on Aug. 7.

Convocation delegates will receive information and reports and make decisions about the life and ministry of the NALC.

Among the most significant items to be considered by the Convocation is a recommendation that the NALC establish its own seminary to provide for the theological education of future NALC pastors.

The Convocation will elect one pastor and one lay person to four-year terms on the Executive Council. Four lay people and nine pastors have been nominated for the positions. The Executive Council functions as the board of directors for the NALC, providing leadership for the church body between the annual Convocations.

There will also be an update on the NALC's application for membership in the Lutheran World Federation and a report on an exciting discipleship initiative being undertaken by the NALC in partnership with The Navigators.

The Convocation will elect members of the Court of Adjudication. Jon Evans of Pittsburgh, Pa., and Pastor Jeffray Greene of Rantoul, Ill., have been nominated for re-election.

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Women of NALC Annual Gathering

"Connecting in Mission to Share God's Love" is the theme of the Women of the NALC annual gathering on Wednesday, Aug. 7, in Pittsburgh, Pa. All women are invited to join in a day of spiritual formation as they learn of mission ministries.

Pastor Josh Hansen of St. Luke's Lutheran Church of Colorado Springs, Colo., will explain how to define, identify and qualify mission needs so that women's groups may create mission partnerships and develop those mission relationships.

There will be times for fellowship, idea sharing and election of new members to The Women's Council. Meet other sisters in Christ, both in your region and across the country as we come together for a full day to Share God's Love.

During the 9 a.m. registration hour before the meeting, members of The Women's Council will be available for an informal "Question and Answer, Idea Sharing and Brainstorming Session" for women to learn about the WNALC, ask questions and share individual ministries. Registration is \$60 (with lunch) and \$35 (without lunch).

Lutheran CORE Convocation

The Rev. Dr. Gemechis Buba, NALC Assistant to the Bishop for Missions, will be the keynote speaker for the morning session of Lutheran CORE's Convocation on Tuesday, Aug. 6.

The vision of Lutheran CORE is to connect all orthodox, traditional Lutherans. In keeping with that vision, the Rev. Steven K. Gjerde, pastor of Zion Lutheran Church, an ELCA congregation in Wausau, Wis., will speak in the afternoon about the relationships among traditional Lutherans regardless of church body affiliation. Pastor Gjerde will then participate in a panel discussion with Pastor Mark Chavez, NALC General Secretary; Pastor Scott Grorud, Augustana District of Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ; and Pastor Beth Schlegel of St. Peter's Lutheran Church (ELCA) in York, Pa. The panel will be moderated by Pastor Paul Ulring, moderator of Lutheran CORE.

The Convocation will also include a brief business meeting to elect Steering Committee members and approve a budget. Various workshops will be offered in the afternoon, uplifting opportunities for mission.

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One of the highlights of the Convocation will be the recognition of Pastor Herb Hafermann for 50 years of mission work in Tanzania. Representatives of the 6-million-member Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania are scheduled to be present to join in the celebration of Pastor Hafermann's work.

Another highlight will be a festive Holy Communion service at First Presbyterian Church, a beautiful Gothic edifice not far from Station Square, which will feature music by the Westmont College Choir of Santa Barbara, Calif., and be preceded by a 30-minute organ and choral prelude.

There also will be numerous displays introducing NALC missions and ministries.

The Convocation is the annual meeting of the NALC. Voting delegates for the NALC Convocation include lay people chosen by their congregations and all NALC pastors. Each congregation is entitled to at least one lay delegate. Those who are not delegates are welcome to attend as visitors.

You may register for the events at www.thenalc.org. Online registration is the preferred method of registration. The registration fee for the NALC Convocation is \$95. The Theological Conference registration fee is \$115, and the Lutheran CORE Convocation fee is \$70.

The registration fee for each event includes lunch during that event. The NALC Convocation fee also includes dinner on Thursday, Aug. 8, but lunch on Friday, Aug. 9, is not included.
