



Being in the Body of Christ

We have many friends and families blessing us with their presence in our worship services. I have been asked about, and this month I would like to take time to define, some of the words we use to describe a personal commitment in our faith. I am speaking of Baptism, Confirmation, and Membership in a congregation.

Baptism the origin of baptism is said to be in the Jewish faith and recorded in the Levitical law as ceremonial washing. One of the purposes was for indoctrination of Gentiles who desired to convert to the Jewish faith. John the Baptist, who was of the Jewish faith, used this ceremony in a new way...preaching a baptism of repentance for the remission of sins. He stated that he baptized with water, but one greater than he would baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire. The act of baptism does not gain anyone salvation, only the sacrifice of Jesus does that. When one is baptized, they are making a public statement of confession of their sinful nature, repentance from their old life, and affirming their faith that Jesus Christ is their Savior. It is stated that going into the water we die to our old selves; coming out of the water we are resurrected with Jesus to a new life in Him.

Confirmation is an intentional commitment to respond to God's grace. Confirmands are generally people who were baptized at birth or a young age where they were not able to fully understand what that commitment meant. Confirmands go through a period of preparation where they receive instruction through classes on the history of the faith, Christian doctrine, spiritual disciplines, and living out the vows to be a follower of Jesus Christ. At confirmation, the confirmand makes a public affirmation of the vows that were made in the baptismal covenant. They make a commitment to live these vows in their life as members of the Church. Confirmation is one step in our journey to seek a closer relationship with Jesus Christ and to explore the questions we have so as to strengthen our personal faith.

Membership in the Church, which is the body of Christ, is achieved by affirmation of Christian doctrine in that there is one God, one Savior - Jesus Christ, the begotten son of God, and the presence of God in our world today - the Holy Spirit. When one admits and confesses to their sinful nature, accepts Jesus Christ as the atonement for the penalty of that sin, and puts their faith and trust in Him alone as their Savior, they receive the grace of God and become a member of the body of Christ. Membership in the church, as a member of a congregation, is becoming part of a community of faith and to unite with a faithful group of fellow believers so as to grow in faith and wisdom to better serve our Lord. Different congregations and/or denominations have varying requirements for being a member of their church. As with any organized group, membership has its privileges. The privilege of having a voice in, and the opportunity to serve in a number of roles in, the life of their church.

In our congregation all are welcome to come and worship, to explore their faith, to find hope, love and peace in a safe and welcoming environment. 


