Here is the summary of income and expenses for the month of August 2023:



Movie Night


"You've got to plead with God so that He can do what only He can do. Then you got to get out of the way and let Him do it."

Miss Clara is one of the main characters in the movie "War Room" ... a woman who uses prayer as her weapon to fight spiritual battles.



Our next movie night will be on Friday, October 20th at 6:30 p.m. in our fellowship hall when we will see WWJD What Would Jesus Do?




Please come and spend an enjoyable evening watching a Christian movie at St. Mark's. (Refreshments will be served.) We look forward to seeing you there!
