Annual Property Report -----2016

This past year a number of projects were completed that were considered to be routine maintenance while others were evaluated with a vision to the future when time, actually money, becomes available. It's important to note that whenever a maintenance task required additional help, there was never a shortage of willing and able volunteers to assist with the projects. The following was completed in 2016:

The old piano that was hopelessly in disrepair was removed from the Fellowship Hall by 4 not very young, but very strong men.

The Fellowship Hall was In need of new and additional shelving. The old shelving was removed, new shelving purchased, assembled, and is now functional in the Hall.

The front entrance to the church was looking shabby due to peeling paint. Old and peeling paint was removed and the entrance was repainted.

The shed in the side parking lot that holds some school material was an eyesore and was upgraded with new stain.

The parking lot remains a disaster. Three differnt paving contractors that did work in Middleburgh were evaluated for the quality of their work and asked to provide estimates to Saint Marks. They did; its expensive, awaiting money.

The church roof was evaluated for repairs and a cost estimate provide by reputable contractor. Very expensive, yet to be approved.

Special thanks to all those who continue to tirelessly support with their time and effort the maintenance issues of our church.

2017 is here and God has again proven to us that we cannot out give God. The Phoebe's have been very busy this year and we still find that giving is so fulfilling and rewarding. It just never gets old. We have been so blessed with donations and the support we get from others. We, as a ministry, are so blessed in many ways, by adding new people to our group and growing our outreach as we go on to bless others.

Our outreach activities in 2016 included a few new places to bless as well as our regular places:

- 23 encouragement baskets were made and delivered
- 39 quilts were given to individuals
- 81 quilts were distributed between Albany Medical Center, Marchand Manor, The Joshua Project, Cobleskill Regional Hospital, Schenectady City Mission, The Alziemer Group, Amsterdam Hospital, Sunnyview Rehabilitation Hospital, The VA in Albany and 18 of these quilts to Haiti.
- 63 infant hats were knit and crocheted and given to Albany Medical for their newborns
- 10 Walker Holders were given to Sunnview Rehabilitation
- 1 Walker holder to Amsterdam Hospital

We also gave 50 plus angel and cross pins out at Sunnyview Rehabilitation which were made by our Phoebe, Janet Abrams.

We again participated in Miracle on Main Street by offering free hot chocolate and brownies and our crafts were also on sale at this event. This is always a very nice event and we have many people who come in just to get warm and look around.

We hosted the reception for Loretta Kennedy which was held at the Middleburgh Fire House. Thank you to all who so willingly offered to make something for this reception.

One of the many highlights of our Monday lunch time is and has always been our bible study. This often leads to many lively discussions as we study God's word. Thanks again to Carolyn Wyckoff who so diligently prepares these studies for us.

We still have between ten and fourteen people most Mondays. Please feel free to stop in and visit or join us any Monday between 9am and 2pm. We will definitely find something for you to do. Our fellowship and devotion time prove to be a wonderful addition to the week.
