#### In A World of Darkness and Light

The Bible tells us that in the beginning 'The earth was without form, and void; and darkness was on the face of the deep'. The Bible also tells us that God was in the beginning and God said 'Let there be light, and there was light. And God saw the light, that it was good; and God divided the light from the darkness.' Again, the Gospel of John instructs us that, 'In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.' 'And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.' Jesus says to us, "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life." The Bible then instructs us, 'And this is the condemnation, that the light has come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil.'

In a recent popular periodical its editors made a list of '21 Books You Don't Have to Read'. The Holy Bible was included on this list. There are comments made regarding people who may or may not have read it. They state 'overall it is certainly not the finest thing that man has ever produced. It is repetitive, self-contradictory, sententious, foolish, and even at times ill-intentioned.'

In recent history we have witnessed more than one popular view in the world to inhibit and/or restrict faith in God. From public prayer, to Biblical wording on public buildings, and now to the Word itself. The news has reported that several people have responded to this periodical's list. One response, by a priest, reported that some 3.9 billion people have read, or heard readings from, the Bible. This is impressive considering the current world population is reported to be 7.2 billion people. If these numbers are accurate, why would the Bible be on a list of 'Books You Don't Have to Read'?

A truth I believe that has been with us from the beginning is that each of us has the free will to choose. As stated in the Bible, 'choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve; as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.' Hear these other statements from the Bible: 'Your word is a lamp to my feet, And a light to my path.'; 'Your word I have hidden in my heart'; 'I will delight myself in Your statutes, I will not forget Your word'; 'This is my comfort in my affliction, For Your word has given me life'; 'My soul faints for Your salvation, But I hope in Your word'; 'I have restrained my feet from every evil way, That I may keep Your word'; 'The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart'; 'I am your fellow servant, and of your brethren the prophets, and of those who keep the words of this book. Worship God."

Friends, these verses from the Word give me encouragement and confirmation that the Bible is a book that I must read. I must read it every day so that it is in my heart, on my mind, and revealed through my life. There are many voices that offer what they believe the Bible does or does not have, of what it says or does not say, of what it means or does not mean. I can only tell you that my help comes from above. I read the Bible prayerfully, and I petition God to give me the understanding I need so that I may follow where God leads me, live as God intended for me to live, and profess the way, the truth, and the life, which is the Word made flesh, my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Ruth Caye Jones wrote in the lyrics of the hymn 'In Times Like These', "In times like these you need a Savior, you need an anchor, you need the Bible."
