

### PHOEBE CIRCLE - 2014 REPORT

Here it is the beginning of 2015 and God is still busy showing the Phoebes that giving is so rewarding and fulfilling. The more we give, the more God provides in the donations and support we get from everyone. We, as a ministry, are blessed in so many ways and joyfully go on to bless others.

Our outreach activities in 2014 include:

- 24 encouragement baskets were made and delivered
- Hats and mittens from our mitten tree were given to our After School Program, Wings as Eagles
  Ministry, Middleburgh Elementary School, Schoharie Central School, Gilboa-Conesville Central
  School, Office of the Aging and Catholic Charities
- 48 quilts delivered to Capital City Mission, Wings as Eagles Ministries, Albany Medical Center and the VA Hospital
- 20 quilts were made for Haiti; Pastor Rodney has made plans for delivery
- 5 fleece blankets were also given to Wings as Eagles Ministry
- 7 quilts were given out locally

The Phoebe's sponsored two dinners to help with the monthly mortgage payment. We were very blessed with the support we received for both. As a thank you for that support, we gave away several quilts as door prizes. At the chicken parmesan dinner, a quilt was given to Edward Johnson and at the chicken and biscuit, three quilts were given to Willie Palmer, Logan Bartholomew and Willie Cater being the recipients.

The Phoebe's held several fundraisers and we say a thank you to all who supported our efforts. Delicious strawberry jam as well as crafts were made and sold to help defray the cost of supplies for our quilts. Our annual pie sale was again a great success.

A new venture was embarked upon this year by the Phoebes as we participated in the Miracle on Main Street. We offered hot coffee, tea and chocolate with brownies (for a monetary donation) and we had many crafts items for sale. These included our snap purses, cozy microwave bowls and necktie purses plus other handmade items. God blessed this event and we made enough money to almost cover another mortgage payment.

Fabric was purchased for new pew covers that were made by several members of the Phoebes. Thank you to Gloria Falcone and her son-in-law for helping us select and purchase the fabric. They really enhance the look of our sanctuary.

We also hosted a reception for our friend and supporter, Ted Palmatier, memorial service.

2014 was a time of growth for the Phoebes as we have had two more volunteers join our Circle. One of the highlights of our Monday lunch time is our Bible study. This has been a great time of learning and discussion. We are still studying "100 Women of the Bible" and has been very educational. Please feel free to visit or join us any Monday between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. We will definitely find a project for you to do and the fellowship and devotion time is wonderful.



We are now into our fourth year of sponsoring St. Mark's Christian After-School Program. We had some minor adjustments to make to keep the program going and are able to continue doing one of God's missions here at St. Mark's.

We have 19 children registered and this year most of them are coming everyday so it can be challenging some days but so rewarding being with them and interacting with them. Ton of thanks and appreciation is given to those staff helpers who work in the homework room. We could not do it without you with all the new standards of learning required.

We retained the same staff from last year which consisted of Patti Bowman, Jessica Miller, Melissa Sniffen, Maureen Sniffen, Sharon Nesbitt and Cheryl Cater working full time. This year along with Bonnie Morton volunteering one day a week, Dennis Foland and Deb Palmatier took on the challenge to help us out and Carolyn Wyckoff is always willing to substitute when needed.
