Jesus Heals!

Have you ever wanted something so badly that you would not take no for an answer? I am sure that we have all been there, those of us who have children when they become sick and if it is a severe sickness, we can't help but worry especially if they are very young.

I think there is no greater fear, than the fear of thinking that your minor child will not survive when they are sick? You would go in search of the best, and demand that they do something to save your child. I remember watching a movie with Denzel Washington a few years ago called John Q. John Q's son Michael collapses while playing baseball as a result of heart failure. John rushes Michael to a hospital emergency room where he is informed that Michael's only hope is a transplant.

Unfortunately, John's insurance won't cover his son's transplant. Out of options, John Q takes the emergency room staff and patients hostage until hospital doctors agree to do the transplant. Desperate the father was heard saying, "Take my heart and give it to him, I will not bury my son, my son will bury me."

Very drastic we would say, and still as a parent we understand that kind of love that will drive us to do whatever is necessary, and we will refuse to take no for an answer.

In our gospel of Matthew 15: 21...We see a similar desperation of a mother who is seeking the healing of her daughter. Her daughter is demon-possessed and she is being tormented by these demons. Her mother is moved by faith, love and desperation so she seeks Jesus out. She knew that he will be able to heal her daughter.

The woman pleaded, "Have mercy on me, son of David." Jesus did not answer her. She was ignored. Some people may have left defeated and crying. Others would have cursed him out and tell him what a horrible person he is for ignoring them in their time of need.

But not this woman, she was on a mission, she knew what she wanted, and she went through lots of trouble to find Jesus where he was. She didn't care that he needed rest; all she cared about was that he was the only one that can save her daughter from these tormenting demons.

So she was not discouraged, she continued to cry out to Jesus, making her request known. Her cry for help even annoyed Jesus' disciples that they urged him to send her away. Get rid of her, she is really annoying! But the woman refused to leave. She knew what she wanted and never gave up until she gets it.

This was indeed a miracle of faith one we would do well to emulate. The focus is not upon the demonpossessed daughter who was healed but upon the mother and her persistent faith in Jesus. She was a woman who would not take "no" for an answer. She had no choice but to have faith in the healing power of Jesus, because she loved her daughter so much. Jesus saw her faith, and the love for her daughter and she was rewarded.

Today I encourage us, to exercise such faith in God, let us go after God, and pray relentlessly to him until we get our blessing. God is good... All the time.... God is good. Amen.




