Operation Christmas Child

Time passes so quickly and it is difficult to believe that Operation Christmas Child collection week is only about three and a half months away. If you have not already done so, now is the time to purchase school supplies for the shoeboxes you will pack. Providing a few basic items such as paper, pencils, a pencil sharpener, and crayons may give a child what he or she needs to attend classes. Please remember to include hygiene items such as a bar of soap, washcloth, comb, and toothbrushes as well as clothing items and small toys such as a ball, stuffed animal, jump rope, doll, cars, etc. Toys are something that many parents are unable to afford, and what child doesn't like to play with toys?

Righteousness

What does it mean to be righteous? The definition is "acting in accord with divine or moral law; free from guilt or sin". In Paul's letter to the Romans, he wrote, "for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God". Can anyone be righteous then? In the New King James translation of the scriptures, righteousness is found 304 times. It is often seen in conjunction with the word judgment. It seems that more and more in our world it is found tied with the word "self".

In the Bible, "righteous" is only used to describe God and Jesus the Christ. We are told in 1 Kings 3:6 that David walked before the Lord in truth, in <u>righteousness</u>, and in uprightness of heart. In Romans 4:3, Galatians 3:6, and James 2:23, it is written that "Abraham believed God and it was accounted to him for righteousness".

Is it then that when we believe God, trust God, live in faith and walk by faith, it will be accounted to us for righteousness? We know that we can never free ourselves from guilt or sin. That the temptations today are no different than they have been throughout time. Jesus resisted all of the same temptations by responding with the *Word*, and encourages us to do the same, to follow Him. From the Gospel of John 8:31-36 "Then Jesus said to those Jews who believed Him, 'If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed. And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.' Jesus answered them, 'Most assuredly, I say to you, whoever commits sin is a slave of sin. And a slave does not abide in the house forever, but a son abides forever. Therefore, if the Son makes you free, you shall be free indeed.'

There we have it. We can either be a slave to sin or a servant to the Lord. That we must believe, truly believe, in God and His precepts and commandments. Accept Jesus Christ's sacrifice as the atonement for our sin, abide in His will and act according to His law. Then we will be learning what righteousness is all about. When self-righteousness loses its hold and walking in righteousness becomes the norm, true healing and miracles will be the norm.

We know that David and Abraham were not flawless. We know that they continually trusted and obeyed God, inspite of the times they trusted in their own wisdom and understanding.

We are living in the continual presence of sin and have been given the ability to resist sin, resist evil in whatever forms it presents itself by striving to live righteously, to act and live in accord with divine law, to trust and obey where God leads us and to respond to Jesus' words wooing us to "follow me".

I have defended my self-righteousness through politically correct jargon that the culture has taught me to use. To feel at ease with the times, I relied on my own wisdom and understanding. May I, may we, like David, Abraham, and many others before us, strive to trust and obey God inspite of ourselves and our desires. May we learn to live to seek "God's kingdom and His righteousness" above all else. AMEN.
